
KTUN also aims to strengthen the education, research and business. We are aware that close cooperation with enterprises is important as they are essential for students to gain experience in the area of their future professions and careers.

KTUN has established a centre with the purpose of further developing the cooperation between our university, industry, businesses and non-governmental organisations. Within the existing agreements with some enterprises, these enterprises guarantee employment to our graduates. Also, it is in the interest of Konya Technical University to achieve the full potential of education and culture as drivers for job creation, economic growth and social fairness as well as a means to experience European identity in all its diversity. The goals are:

- spending time abroad to study and learn the standard;
- school and higher education diplomas that are recognised across the EU;
- knowing two languages in addition to one's mother tongue should become the norm;
- everyone should be able to access high quality education, irrespective of their socio-economic background; and
- everyone should have a strong sense of their identity as Europeans, or Europe's cultural heritage and its diversity.

In monitoring all the mentioned expected impacts, KTUN will follow up some steps such as:

- Holding at least one meeting every month to share the latest updates about the agreement and mobility numbers, and the issues encountered by exchange incoming and outgoing students and staffs.
- Being in contact with the students and staff through social media, meetings, etc.
- Emailing partners once a month to ask about the latest updates
- Holding meetings at least twice a year to introduce students and staff to the other students and staff to promote experience share.
- Writing a report after each mobility activity to keep record of personal experience outcomes of students and staff.

The European Student Card Initiative will enable each exchange student to easily and safely identify and register themselves electronically at higher education institutions within Europe when moving abroad for studies, eliminating the need to complete onsite registration procedures and paper work so KTUN will take the necessary initiatives to implement the European Student Card Initiative as soon as possible in order to adjust the new policies and regulations on time. This process will start with the design of new student cards then a new student software system will be introduced to all students and staff. In order to promote the use of the programme's Erasmus+ mobile App all the students will be informed about the app, and advised to download it to get the latest news on time. Also, a link for direct download will be shared on KTUN Erasmus Office website.

Full automatic recognition of earned ECTS credits (study and/or traineeships) is given to all achievements as defined and guaranteed by KTUN. After the mobility period, the recognition process starts automatically in correspondence to the original learning agreement. The achievements are recognised and counted towards the final degree made apparent in their transcript of records and Diploma Supplements. The students also have the right to object in case of any recognition problems after their mobility period. Transcripts including detailed information of the incoming students' achievements are given to them within 2 weeks after the end date of the mobility period.

Staff mobility is always encouraged by KTUN, as it helps to develop communication, and contribute international sharing of knowledge and expertise. Staff mobility is promoted among teaching and administrative staff for its positive influence on career prospects, and strengthens with partner universities. Mobility of staff is supported through personal counseling and cultural preparation by the Erasmus Office. University also welcomes visiting staff and the contribution they make to its teaching program.

Any short or long term staff mobility will also be recognised, rewarded and encouraged by KTUN with benefits such as: a letter of gratitude signed by the university rector, advantages in academic promotion etc.
